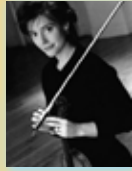

## Update Public Safety Complex

It's the biggest construction project currently underway by the Borough of Avalon. And the men and women who serve you in public safety cannot wait until it's finished!

Avalon is building a brand new Public Safety Complex, located on Dune Drive between 30th and 31st Streets. You'll see work crews building the new complex all summer long. Work began in 2007, phase I of this construction will be completed later this year. Avalon's new public safety complex will meet various state requirements, provide a new dispatch area, and also will be the new home for the rescue squad, which relocates from an older, metal building.

The new 17,737 square foot Public Safety Complex will replace the current Police/Emergency Medical Services building which has stood for 37 years. . And, the new complex will not only house the Police/EMS services, but will also serve as the home for other emergency operations in Avalon as well. The current Rescue Squad operations have been placed temporarily in the Avalon Volunteer Fire Department quarters for the past four years.

The new Public Safety Complex will correct many issues currently in the older building, including a lack of adequate space, records management, and compliance with various regulations relating to the New Jersey Department of Corrections. The new complex will be open 24/7 to residents and visitors, and will also have a 400KW emergency generator for the "self sustaining" emergency needs of this new facility. The new generator means there will never be an interruption in

Avalon's emergency services. Additionally, this new complex will put all of the Borough's emergency vehicles and equipment in one central location, above the flood plain. The Public Safety Complex will house the Police Department, Volunteer Fire Department, Emergency Management, Rescue Squad,



Beach Tag, and Communications functions for the borough, and create additional, on-site parking spaces. Additionally, this facility will have a restroom that will be available to the public 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

And the best news? Over the past two years, approximately \$750,000 in funding for the project has come from the Cape May County Public Improvements Joint Venture Program, sponsored by the Cape May County Freeholders. Look for the grand opening of Avalon's New Public Safety Complex to occur early in the spring of 2009.

I would like to personally thank you for making Avalon what it is today: A safe, fun, thriving shore community filled with great people, hundreds of activities and special events throughout the year, a vibrant business district, and a resort where visitors come back year after year to experience everything Avalon has to offer.

Much work is done in the "offseason" by employees, volunteers and residents of Avalon to get us prepared for a terrific summer season. And I'm very excited about the unique attractions and events that only Avalon has to offer. From our state of the art community library with educational and fun activities, to the return of the Bay-Atlantic Symphony, to community events presented by our civic groups, business community, and the Avalon Department of Recreation. You will certainly find each week you spend in Avalon filled with fun, providing you and your family with memories that last forever.

I personally invite you to participate in the second season of the Bay-Atlantic Symphony in Avalon. The first season was an amazing success, and we're proud to host "Symphony by the Sea" again this year. Avalon Free Public Library and the Avalon Performing Arts Council have partnered to bring four concerts this summer. ## Update on the condition of Avalon's beaches

According to the Avalon Visitor and Resident Survey, 71 percent of people who visit Avalon do so because of our beautiful beaches. In 2008, Avalon officials continue to battle the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection over a State Aid Agreement that deals with funding for beach replenishment work.

In our eyes, the agreement is overbroad, vague, and puts coastal communities like Avalon at risk. Avalon has signed previous State Aid Agreements because we are proponents of public access. Avalon currently provides 62 public access points along our four miles of beachfront, which averages to about 15 access points per mile. And we've spent millions of dollars in municipal funding on various beach and dune work.

However, this new State Aid Agreement that the DEP wants us to sign is filled with flaws, and we were incredulous when we read it. The agreement calls for 24 hour public access to all waterways, including our beaches, with no regard for danger and liability. For instance, if a major storm would arrive on a Saturday night, the agreement would prohibit borough officials from closing the beaches until we are able to reach someone at the DEP who would be empowered to make that decision. And, if the state would determine that Avalon needed more parking, the borough could actually be forced to condemn private properties to turn them into parking lots. Furthermore, the agreement requires the Borough to install more bathrooms, including Port O' Potties, to be located at street ends by the beach.

Avalon has sued the New Jersey DEP over this proposed agreement. There was a court hearing held before Superior Court Judge Steven Perskie, who said in court, "I don't understand how any rational person who knows anything about the subject matter could have reached some of the conclusions that the Department has reached in the promulgation of these regulations." Now, we await an appellate court hearing and decision on the agreement until we can address the beaches that have been eroded.

You'll find some of the problem spots in the area between 12th and 14th Streets. We're asking that this summer, you use caution in that area until we're able to get past this issue with the state and get the beach funding Avalon needs, and deserves.

On behalf of Avalon's Borough Council, our great employees, volunteers, and our community...welcome back, it's great to see you again! We are "Cooler By A Mile" in Avalon, and we hope this newsletter gives you a glimpse of what you can enjoy this summer!

## Trolley Service

### Leave the driving to us

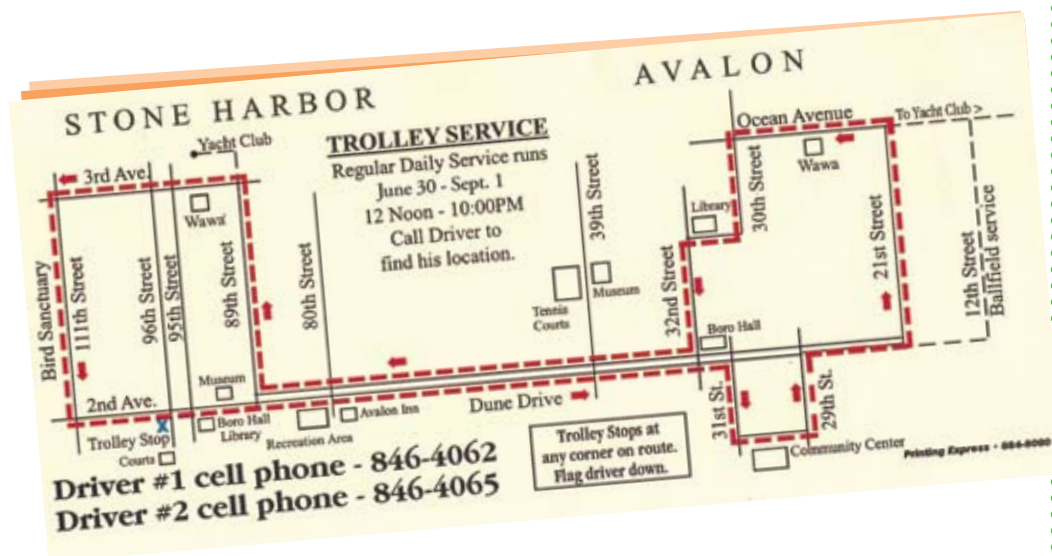
Want to ride in style and comfort, and not worry about parking? Take advantage of the popular trolley service, operated in Avalon and Stone Harbor. In 2008, the trolley will run on Saturday, May 24 & Sunday, May 25 of Memorial Day Weekend. Summer service will begin Monday, June 30 and runs through Labor Day weekend. The trolley is available from Noon through 10pm each day, and departs from Avalon and Stone Harbor every half hour.

You can pick up the trolley from any corner on the route, simply wave your hand and the trolley will stop for you. And, you can also call a driver by dialing (609) 846-4062 or (609) 846-4065.

The fare to ride the trolley is \$2; however, if you are going to Avalon's Library, Museum, Borough Hall, Community Hall, or ball fields, the ride is free, as long as the facility is open. Some participating merchants also offer free return trips. And something new this summer: purchase a "day pass" from any bus driver and ride all day for only \$3.

The trolley company also runs a separate trolley Friday and Saturday nights during the summer from 9:30pm-2:30am, in the event your evening runs later than you had planned.

## Indulge in Avalon this Summer!

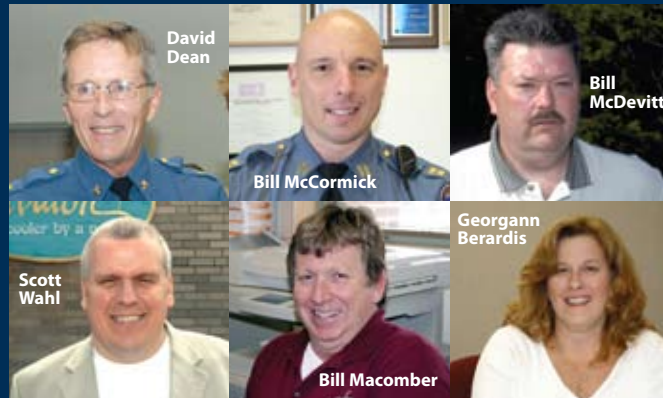
Have you taken a drive or a stroll through Avalon's business district lately? Take a look around, and see what's new for your shopping and dining experience in Avalon for 2008.

## People in Transition

Avalon's police department has a new chief. **David Dean** served the Avalon Police Department as captain for 10 years before being promoted to Chief of Police. Dean's new role will put him in charge of all policy for the Avalon Police Department, personnel issues, the department's budget, and discipline. Dean joined the police force on January 28, 1987. Chief Dean was born and raised in Georgia, and currently lives in Cape May Court House, with his wife, Robin. Robin Dean is known on the 7 Mile Beach as the kindergarten teacher for Avalon and Stone Harbor.

The Avalon Police Department also has a new captain, **Bill McCormick**. Captain McCormick was promoted to the rank of captain on August 22, 2007. He served the Avalon Police Department for 10 years as a sergeant prior to his promotion. Captain McCormick is now the overall operations manager for the police department, and oversees all scheduling, and day to day personnel issues. McCormick lives in Ocean View with his wife, Anne Marie, who's a member of the Avalon Rescue Squad, and the Vineland Police Department.

Also on August 22 Officer **Bill McDevitt** was promoted to Sergeant. Sergeant McDevitt has been with the department for 21 years. Along with his patrol duties he will now also be responsible for the supervision of the officers within the department. McDevitt will be representing the Avalon Police Department again this year as he rides in the Police Unity Tour. The tour is an annual bicycle ride in honor of our nation's fallen officers. The ride begins in Avalon & ends in Washington, D.C. at the National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial during national Police Week.

**Scott Wahl** is the new Public Information Officer for the Borough of Avalon. Scott will be telling local, regional, and national media about everything that's great about Avalon. He'll be writing press releases about Avalon events, doing a complete redesign of the borough's website, and will be very active in the social and business community. Scott has worked for radio stations WCZT and WILW for years, and has penned a newspaper column for the Gazette Leader.

**Bill Macomber** is the Acting Public Works Director for the Borough of Avalon. Bill has many years of experience with the department, and has been responsible for the maintaining all of the public works vehicles in the community. Bill has learned from the best, Harry de Butts, and is now responsible for keeping Avalon a beautiful community.

**Georgann Berardis** is the new Deputy Borough Clerk for Avalon. Georgann started with the borough on April 8, 2008. She will assist Borough Clerk Amy Kleuskens with all of the day to day duties of the clerk's office. Berardis lives in South Seaville with her husband and three children.

## Thanks Harry!

Avalon wishes the very best for Harry deButts, who's retiring as the Public Works Director for the Borough of Avalon. Harry has been a Borough employee since 1987, and he has spearheaded countless projects in the community. In 1989, Avalon became one of the first communities in our area to have an Emergency Operating Plan. Soon afterwards, Harry helped establish a beach/waterfront maintenance plan for Avalon. From 1993-1999, Avalon won seven of eight Quality New Jersey Ocean/Beach Quality awards. Harry also attended many meetings in Washington, DC to help Avalon with its various beach replenishment projects. Harry effectively combined his public works and emergency management duties to help set Avalon on a course as a national leader in storm mitigation, beach protection, dune construction/maintenance, and infrastructure improvements. Harry also worked tirelessly with State Police Office of Emergency Management and with FEMA; he often spoke about these meetings and topics during countless appearances at various civic group functions.

## Global Connect

Are you connected? In September, Avalon became part of the Global Connect network. In the event of an emergency, your local 967 and 368 telephone number will be called automatically when there is important information you need to know right away. For instance, if the National Weather Service issues a coastal flood "watch" or "warning", Avalon's Emergency Management Department will have a message phoned to you immediately. We will be testing this system in early summer to make sure that you are connected!



The program is free, and all 967 and 368 telephone numbers through normal landlines are automatically enrolled. However, if you would like to have your cell phone, or another phone number dialed as part of the network, just sign up on the Borough's website at avalonboro.org. It takes less than five minutes to sign up another phone number. Also, if you have voice over IP telephone service (ie: Vonage, Comcast), it's a good idea to sign up that telephone number as well.

Remember, Avalon has its own 1630AM radio station which will broadcast local emergency alert information immediately as well. 1630AM will also have much more local content on it in the coming weeks!

Avalon Police are proud to keep our community safe, all year long. The Avalon Police Department is constantly being proactive, addressing community concerns before they can even become larger problems. Here are some ways that you can help:

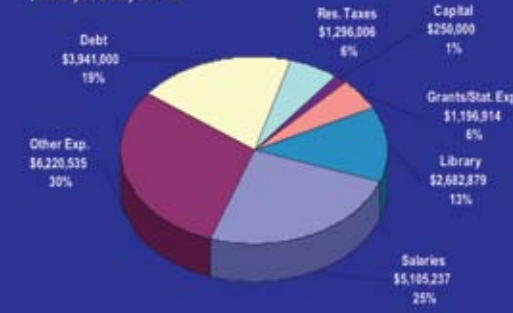
- You are encouraged to fill out a form that includes a contact name and phone number for your property. You can be the primary contact, or it could be another person as well. If there is a discrepancy at a property, Avalon Police would like to reach out to that person right away. All numbers given to us remain confidential and will be used only in emergencies. Visit police headquarters at the public safety building to fill out the form.

- Avalon Police reminds you to have your address clearly displayed in a manner that is visible from the street, and at night, and is compliant with the borough ordinance. Secure your personal property at night, including your home, bicycles, and vehicles. Pet owners should make sure a valid phone number is on the collar in case the pet gets loose, so we can contact you.

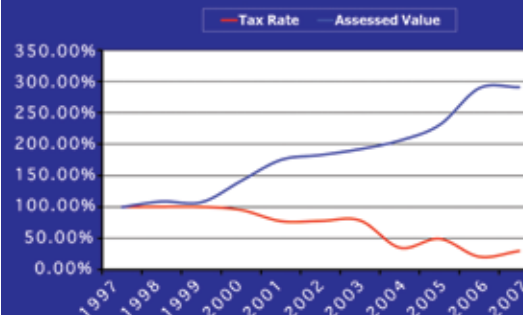
- Seniors should take advantage of our "Senior Alone" program. It's free, and is very successful at insuring the safety and well being of seniors. Seniors check in once daily with the police dispatcher.

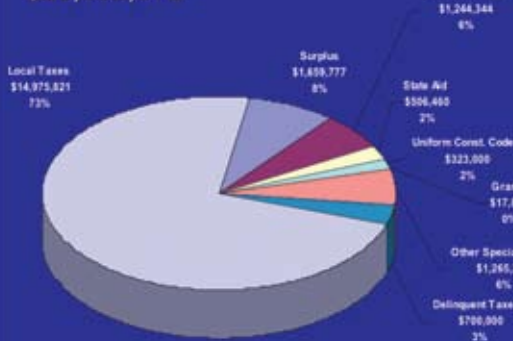
## Current Fund Expenditures \$20,692,572

## 2008 Budget Message From Avalon's Borough Council

Every New Jersey municipality struggled this year to put together their local budgets. The budget concerns in the state of New Jersey are still not settled, and lawmakers are trying to figure out ways to cut spending.

Avalon's Borough Council tackled the local budget during the winter and spring, holding various meetings and sharing ideas on how to get a handle on revenues, expenditures, and the tax rate. Many towns in the state of New Jersey this year will see sizeable increases in their local purpose tax rates, especially along the shore where there are expenses that mainland communities simply do not have.

Fortunately, Avalon's council has succeeded in avoiding a major tax hike this year, even with the state's financial difficulties. The local purpose tax rate in Avalon this year will be 17.1 cents per \$100 of assessed valuation; Avalon will continue to have the lowest overall tax rate in Cape May County. The tax rate increased by only 1.6 cents this year.

Council has carefully tracked expenditures and revenues for years, and this year was impacted by the state's fiscal woes. Avalon is getting approximately \$463,000 in aid from New Jersey this year; that represents a \$42,000 cut in aid from the state. And, Avalon will not be getting any grants from the New Jersey Department of Transportation this year, again due to the state's own financial problems.

Despite this cut in aid, Avalon will continue to provide the same level of public safety, services, and programs that you enjoy in our community. Avalon remains in tremendous financial shape, which is proven by the Borough's high bond rating, set by Moody's, which is as high as any rating achieved by any coastal town that borders the Atlantic Ocean, and the highest of any community in Cape May County. The growth in our local economy continues, which helps offset the need for a major tax hike. The ratable base continued to grow in 2007 in Avalon, and we expect further growth in 2008 as well.

The borough continues to invest in its infrastructure, making the community a jewel along the East Coast. Avalon has resurfaced 69% of local streets since 1991, with four more being done before the summer season. And this year, Avalon will continue to make improvements, with repairs to the boardwalk, and the purchase of some new public works equipment. Avalon will also install new playground equipment, and make improvements to some public buildings, including the Senior Center. See related story about the closing of Borough Hall for renovations.

A long-awaited back bay dredging project is also getting underway this year (see graphic below). After the summer season, the state will spend \$800,000 on a major dredging project on the state's own channels. The work is expected to begin on September 15 and last for about three months. The path you see in blue will be dredged to a depth of six feet below mean low water.

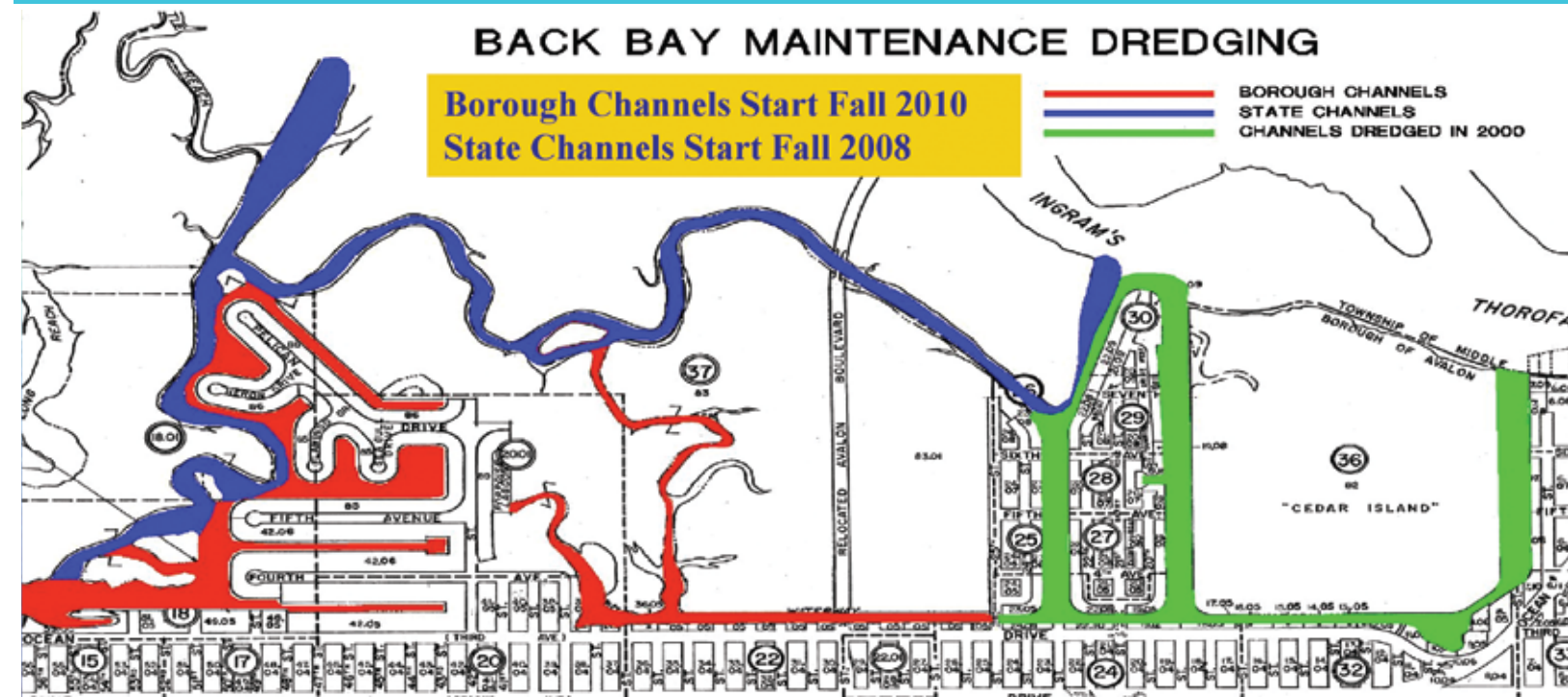
Avalon's council continues to save your tax dollars by negotiating shared services agreements with other entities. Right now, Avalon has 24 shared service agreements in place. Water and sewer rates have not been adjusted since 1993. And Avalon's strong financial standing is evident by \$2.4 million in surplus funding available in the event of an emergency; having a healthy surplus also helps Avalon achieve our very high bond rating as well.

## Beach Tag Fees

To partially offset the cost of maintaining and protecting its beaches for your enjoyment, Avalon requires that beach tags be worn by all using the beach, 12 years or older, 10am-5pm, June 1 through September 1, 2008. Pre-season beach tags may be purchased weekends at the Beach Tag Booth at community Hall. Other beach tags can be purchased daily through September 1 at the booth, or beginning June 1 from beach tag inspectors on the beach. Beach tag fees are: pre-season (purchased on or before May 31) \$19.00; season (effective June 1) \$24.00; weekly (Saturday through Saturday), \$12.00 and daily, \$6.00. Reciprocity of beach tags is observed between Avalon and Stone Harbor.
